# Center for Cultural Innovation in Partnership with Zoo Labs Announce the 2024 Fund Recipients

San Francisco Bay Area – The Center for Cultural Innovation (CCI) today announced the 2024 Zoo Labs: FUND grant recipients. Fourteen unrestricted grants ranging from \$5,000 - \$50,000 were awarded to Bay Area BIPOC-led artist teams with music businesses that are contributing to the region's arts and culture ecosystem in positive ways. In addition to receiving a cash award, grantees will have access to a suite of mentorship resources offered by Zoo Labs: LEARN, including on-demand artist-tailored entrepreneurial courses, virtual group learning and networking sessions, and a curated pairing with a business mentor.

A total of 97 eligible applications were received across the four award tiers. Of these, the fourteen business recipients and the Bay Area counties they represent are:

(Santa Clara) The Underground Rainbow Experiment (Alameda) Zoo Labs: FUND was created to address the critical lack of financial support for music entrepreneurs in the Bay Area, particularly BIPOC artists, seeking to launch or grow their creative ventures.

Grants were awarded to teams based on the potential for funding to have both a short and long-term impact, such as seeding the launch of a business, accelerating a business's growth, or investing in the untapped potential of an established business.

"We are continually inspired by the incredible talent and innovation showcased by our 2024 Zoo Labs: FUND grantees—and even more inspired by how they impact our local communities," said Zoo Labs founders Vinitha and David Watson. "It's an honor to support their journeys as they elevate their creative businesses."

CCI Program Officer Stephanie Barajas reflected, "As we conclude this fourth cycle, we remain amazed by the creativity and entrepreneurial spirit of our grantees. CCI is proud to partner with Zoo Labs in providing substantial and unrestricted grants that empower Bay Area music entrepreneurs to achieve greater self-determination in their artistic pursuits."

Two, three-member panels were invited by CCI to review Zoo Labs: FUND applications and make grantee recommendations. For the \$5,000 and \$15,000 award tiers, panelists included Jonathan Borca (performing artist, storyteller, and arts commissioner), Maryela Perez (curator, DJ, and cultural worker), and Annah Sidigu (poet, composer, and songwriter). For the \$25,000 and \$50,000 award tiers, panelists included Carman Gaines (artist, advocate, and nonprofit leader), PC Muñoz (musician, producer, writer, and program creator), and Akiko Sampson (record label owner, musician, and video director).

The 2024 cycle of Zoo Labs: FUND awarded \$225,000 in unrestricted grants. The program was made possible by Vinitha and David Watson, in addition to the support of individual donors.
